Travel corridors

You will not have to self-isolate if you're arriving and staying in England from a country, territory or region on the travel corridors list. You are required to fill out a passenger locator form, click on the link below. This form must be completed before your arrival in the UK.

You will still be required to self-isolate if you have visited or stopped in any country that is not on the list in the previous 14 days. Visiting includes making a transit stop.
